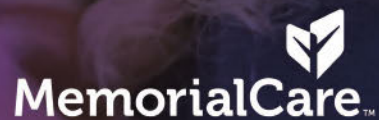

The impact of our hospitals was boosted by **2,179 donors** who gave a total of **\$14,732,266** last year, and by past donors who created **endowments**, which together had a total market value of **\$124,622,741** as of June 30, 2025.



We are Recognized for Superior Care Once Again

Our hospitals consistently rank among the nation's and region's best, earning recognition from performance-based award programs for excellence across a wide range of medical specialties and procedures. These represent just a few of our many accolades.



American Heart Association: We improve patient care by following and advancing AHA treatment guidelines. Through the AHA's Get With The Guidelines initiative, our teams apply proven knowledge to improve patient recovery and outcomes, earning recognition in 2025 for excellence in stroke and heart failure care.



U. S. News and World Reports: In 2025, we received numerous high-performing rankings, including a top 17 national ranking for Obstetrics & Gynecology for the fourth consecutive year. With recognition across more than 20 specialties, we rank among the top 7 hospitals in the Los Angeles Metro Area and in the top 3% of California acute care hospitals.



Healthgrades: Once again, Healthgrades recognized us with five-star ratings in multiple specialties including back and neck surgery, upper GI surgeries, and respiratory failure treatment. Healthgrades' 2025 analysis shows that if all hospitals performed at five-star levels, over 224,000 lives and 141,000 complications could potentially be prevented.

Long Beach Medical Center

Tougher than Cancer

At just 29, Cori Reynolds was diagnosed with Stage 3 invasive ductal carcinoma, a particularly aggressive form of breast cancer. Facing this terrifying diagnosis, Cori, whose family has deep, generational ties to the Long Beach community, found strength in the support programs at

MemorialCare Todd Cancer Institute (TCI) at Long Beach Medical Center.

Cori credits her care team for addressing her mental and emotional needs through Women Guiding Women, which paired her with a cancer survivor for guidance. Her journey culminated with an emotional bell-ringing ceremony, marking the completion of her treatment. She celebrated this milestone while walking in the 25th Annual Team Spirit Long Beach Cancer 5K.

"Cancer is tough, but I'm tougher," she says. Cori's message to others facing similar challenges? "Focus on the positives, lean into the support around you, and know that cancer doesn't have to rule your life."

When Innovation Meets Determination

When 17-year-old Logan, a dedicated swimmer and water polo athlete, fractured his wrist's small scaphoid bone after being struck by a car, his biggest fear was missing time in the pool. Following surgery with Dr. Anna Acosta, Logan needed specialized rehabilitation to heal quickly without compromising his passion.

Occupational Therapist Cynthia Hinshaw, a hand therapy specialist, provided the answer: a custom water-safe brace. This innovative solution allowed Logan to train, attend water polo camps, and compete in the Junior Olympics.

Less than a year post-surgery, Logan has regained full range of motion in his wrist.

Beyond the Bedside: How 46 Years of Nursing Inspired Phyllis Nation's Gift

Having worked as a nurse for 46 years, Phyllis Nation understands the value of support—a lesson she learned not just on the job, but from her own family's struggles.

Though Phyllis didn't treat cancer patients, breast cancer and Parkinson's disease run in her family.
